TOC: Test of Choice (specify test on entry Management reserves the right to combine, delete, or add classes dependent on entries.

Opportunity classes: Entry in these classes does not require either USEF or USDF horse IDs or rider/owner memberships No cross entry between Opportunity classes and Open classes.

## PRIZE LIST DIRECTIVES

**AWARDS:** Prize and six ribbons. High Score Awards: Training to Fourth Levels, PSG, I1-GP, CDCTA Adult and Junior High Scores (excluding Young Horse, MFS, and Intro tests). The Jockey Club Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.) is offering ribbons to the top placing Thoroughbred Intro, Training, and First Level. There is also an award for High Point Young TB. Eligible horses must provide T.I.P. Numbers to event organizer with entry. The Jockey Club T.I.P. High Point Young Thoroughbred Award will be given to the highest placing Thoroughbred at the competition (regardless of division) that is in its first or second year of showing. Virginia Bred Recognition Awards - cash prizes! To promote excellence in breeding and training of horses foaled in Virginia. CDCTA is happy to announce that we have once again been selected as a recipient of the VHIB's VA Bred grant. With this grant, cash prizes will be given to best scoring winners in our 2018 recognized Dressage and Eventing shows as well as Year End awards! \$100 cash award to be given to high score VA Bred horse in the following Levels:

### **VA Bred: Intro/Training, First, Second, Third/Fourth, FEI (total of 5 awards).**

Only horses that have been foaled in Virginia are eligible to qualify for VA Bred awards. Owners should submit proof of eligibility along with a completed Special Awards Entry form (at the end of the prize list), with each show registration form. Proof of eligibility for VA Bred awards may be confirmed by a copy of breed registry papers indicating place of foaling or a confirming statement (at the end of the prize list) or birth record from a licensed veterinarian with knowledge of the place of birth. Awards are given to horse owners.

### **ENTRIES:**

1. Hand Written and Snail Mail: Print the current Region One entry form (available at [www.usdfregion1.org](http://www.usdfregion1.org)) Snail mail the completed signed form, check, Coggins, USEF Affiliates Membership Verification Service print-out, copy of test to qualify for a freestyle ride (if applicable). Snail mail to the Entry Secretary. With this method, the office fee is \$35.
2. Online Application and Snail Mail: Log on to [www.EquestrianEntries.com](http://www.EquestrianEntries.com) and follow the instructions to enter the show but do not submit the payment. Print out the Equestrian Entries report and obtain signatures from Rider, Owner, and Trainer. Snail mail the Equestrian Entries report, check, Coggins, copy of qualifying freestyle test (if applicable), and copy(ies) of Para-Equestrian documents (if applicable) to the Entry Secretary. With this method, the office fee is \$35.
3. Total Online Application: Log on to [www.EquestrianEntries.com](http://www.EquestrianEntries.com) and follow the instructions to enter the show, submit the Coggins and other documents and signatures, and make your payment. Equestrian Entries will forward your entry, payment, and all other documents to Shannon Bossung, Show Secretary. This method will cost you 3% of the cost of your fees plus \$5.00. With this method, the office fee is \$35

## ENTRY DOCUMENTATION REQUIREMENTS.

### **Entry Information Requirements:**

**TAKE NOTE - THERE ARE THREE (3) RELEASE FORMS AS WELL AS THE ENTRY FORM THAT MUST BE SIGNED AND INCLUDED WITH YOUR ENTRY.**

**Entry Information Requirements: Competitors are responsible to provide valid membership numbers on the entry form for all horse, owner, rider, and trainer names listed on the entry form. USEF and USDF registration is verified electronically if valid membership numbers are provided on the entry form. Safe Sport Training must have been completed for USEF memberships to be valid. You may be asked to provide copies of your membership documents, if your memberships cannot be verified for any reason.**

All hard copy entries must include copies of all memberships for horse, owner, rider and trainer listed on entry form. NO MAILED ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT MEMBERSHIP CARD COPIES & COGGINS.

**No horse will be permitted** on the grounds without a valid health certificate or proof of vaccinations (Equine Influenza Virus & Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) within 6 months prior to arriving. Rule GR845

**SAFE SPORT TRAINING** is required for all **riders, owners and trainers** within 30 days of membership. If Safe Sport Training has not been completed within 30 days of membership, entries will not be accepted until proof of completion is provided. If membership is renewed during show, Safe Sport Training must be completed within 30 days or results will be nullified.

- Current USEF membership (or n/m fees) for Rider, Owner and Trainer, Coach
- Current USDF membership (or n/m fees, number) for Rider and Owner. Rider's USDF membership may be either Participating or Group, Owner's USDF membership may be Participating, Group or Business; if Rider/Owner's USDF # is a non-member ID #, the USDF non-member fee must be paid.
- USDF Horse ID.
- Current (1 Yr) negative Coggins.
- For Adult Amateur classes/status - USEF membership card must declare Amateur • Juniors and Young Riders **must** include birthdate.
- Freestyle entries - copy of a 63% + at the highest test of the MFS level or higher (exempt: FEI Jr /Yr/ Pony and Para).

FOR GAIG / USDF QUALIFYING CLASSES ALSO INCLUDE:

- Check "Qualifying" and add \$15 per Qualifying class.

- Copies of USEF and USDF Horse Registrations (not HID #s).
  - Rider must have current Participating USDF membership; Owner must have current Participating or Business USDF membership.
  - Rider and Owner must have current USEF membership.
- ALL ENTRIES must have THREE signatures - Rider, Owner and Trainer. Legal Guardian must sign for riders under 18 yrs. Trainer blank must be signed by person over 18 who assumes responsibility for horse. (Parents who sign as trainer are exempt from membership requirements).** See [www.usdf.org](http://www.usdf.org) and [www.usef.org](http://www.usef.org) and/or USEF Rule Book for further details on entry requirements.

## COVID-19 INFORMATION:

NO BRIDLE NUMBERS WILL BE RELEASED UNTIL THE WAIVERS ARE SIGNED AND THERE IS A COMPLETE ENTRY WITH ALL FEES PAID. PLEASE UNDERSTAND IF WE ARE FORCED TO CANCEL DUE TO THE COVID 19 PANDEMIC.

Participants are required to self-monitor their temperature once daily prior to entering the competition grounds. Anyone with a temperature of 99.5° F (37.5° C) or higher may not enter the facility. • Anyone who: exhibits COVID-19 symptoms, has tested positive for COVID-19 within last two weeks, or \*has been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 within the last two weeks\* cannot enter the competition grounds. \*Exception: Healthcare personnel who have treated patients using appropriate medical-grade PPE during the course of performing professional duties are exempted from this restriction. Refer to Appendix A for CDC guidelines for self-isolation/quarantine directives in the event a person has a fever or exhibits other symptoms of COVID-19. • **Participants are required to wear a facemask or face covering when in any setting where there is a possibility of being within six feet of other individuals, and when not mounted on a horse.** You can find recommendations for proper use of face masks and face coverings via the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention website. \*\*A participant may choose to wear a facemask or face covering when mounted on a horse and cannot be disqualified or penalized for doing so while competing.

Social Distancing/Participation Protocols • Comply with social distancing requirements at all times while on the competition grounds. • Wash hands often and adhere to other sanitization practices throughout the day.

## OTHER ENTRY REQUIREMENTS.

- **Mailed Entries:** Mail entry packets to the show secretary. Do not send entry packets via registered, certified, or signature-required mail. No telephone, fax, or email entries will be accepted. **MUST BE RECEIVED BY CLOSING DATE TO BE CONSIDERED TIMELY.**
- **Grounds Fee:** A \$30 per day grounds fee must be paid for each horse entered.
- **Non-Competing Horses:** Must be registered with the Show Secretary. The owner/representative must provide copy of a current Coggins test report, vaccination record, pay the office fee, and pay a daily grounds fee(s). The owner/representative of non-competing horses does not pay the USEF Drug/Medication fee. Non-competing horses must wear a bridle number at all times when they are not trailered or stabled.
- **Test Versions:** Current editions of the USEF tests for Training Level through Fourth Level, 4 Year Old, Brentina Cup, and Developing Horse tests will be used. Current editions of the the FEI Prix St. Georges, Intermediare I, Intermediare II, Grand Prix, 5-Year Old, 6-Year Old, Junior Rider, Young Rider tests will be used. <b>Incomplete Entry Fee. \$25 Charged to any entry still missing signatures, coggins, vaccination form or MFS verification, etc. no later than one week prior to the show date.</b>
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Fees must be paid in full with entry form. If a check for entry fees is returned, the entry will be placed on a waiting list until all fees are paid in cash, money order, or cashier's check. ALL RETURNED CHECKS ARE SUBJECT TO A \$50 SERVICE FEE. A master verification of all USDF/USEF recordings and memberships can be generated at [www.eqverification.com](http://www.eqverification.com).

Be sure to include with your entry: Current Negative Coggins test, current Vaccination record, USEF and USDF numbers with copies of the cards and ALL required signatures in accordance with the USEF Rules. USEF members must provide proof of current membership (USEF card or copy thereof) either with the entry or upon check-in at show office. Membership affidavit fee is \$5.

- Competitors are reminded that USEF rules require entry forms to be signed completely in all three signature blocks – original signatures, no photocopies.

- An acknowledgement of entry showing status will be emailed to each competitor upon receipt of entry. Please check this for any errors. Correct entry is the responsibility of the competitor. If you have any problems, or do not receive this confirmation, please contact the Secretary.

**Refunds:** NO refunds after closing date. Until closing date, refunds on entries minus \$35 office fee. NO refunds in the event of cancellation of classes due to severe weather or other emergencies. No refunds will be issued for amounts less than \$20.

**Times:** Times will not be mailed. Times will be available on the website [www.cdcta.com](http://www.cdcta.com) approximately five days before the show, as well as on the Fox Village website.

**From Washington Dulles International Airport:**

Take the Dulles Toll Road 267 exit toward Washington/U.S. 28. Keep left at the fork to continue toward VA-28 S/Sully Rd. Keep right at the fork to continue toward VA-28 S/Sully Rd. Keep right at the fork and merge onto VA-28 S/Sully Rd. Proceed 8.3 miles to onramp to Interstate 66 west. Exit on to Interstate 66 West. Proceed 21.3 miles to exit 31 for VA-245 toward The Plains/Old Tavern. Take exit and turn right onto Old Tavern Road at the end of the off ramp. Proceed 1.1 miles to the stop sign. Turn left at the stop sign onto VA-55 W/Main St. Proceed 0.6 miles to Co Rd 704/Whitewood Rd and turn right. After 1.3 miles, the road bends to the left, becoming Co Rd. 707/Milestone Rd. Continue on Milestone Rd to the stop sign. Turn right on to Co Rd 709/Zulla Rd. Proceed 0.3 miles to Beverly Lane on the right. The entrance to the Beverly Equestrian Center is the first driveway on the right off Beverly Lane.

**From Washington, D.C.:**

Proceed west on Interstate 66 into Virginia. Take exit 31 for VA-245 toward The Plains/Old Tavern. Turn right onto Old Tavern Road at the end of the off ramp. Proceed 1.1 miles to the stop sign. Turn left at the stop sign onto VA-55 W/Main St. Proceed 0.6 miles to Co Rd 704/Whitewood Rd and turn right. After 1.3 miles, the road bends to the left, becoming Co Rd. 707/Milestone Rd. Continue on Milestone Rd to the stop sign. Turn right onto Co Rd 709/Zulla Rd. Proceed 0.3 miles to Beverly Lane on the right. The entrance to the Beverly Equestrian Center is the first driveway on the right off Beverly Lane.

**From Middleburg:**

Proceed west on US-50/John Mosby Hwy/Lee Jackson Memorial Hwy. Turn left at Zulla Road/State Route 709. Proceed 5.8 miles to Beverly Lane on the left. The entrance to the Beverly Equestrian Center is the first driveway on the right off Beverly Lane.

**From Warrenton:**

Proceed north on US-17 James Madison Hwy for approximately 8 miles. Turn right at Belvoir Rd/Co Rd 709. Proceed 3.8 miles to Beverly Lane on the right. The entrance to Beverly Equestrian is the first driveway on the right off Beverly Lane.

**OTHER:**

- Numbers must be worn at all times when a horse is being exercised or ridden.
- USEF approved headgear must be worn at all times when on horseback.
- All dogs must be on a leash. No dogs in show office.

Medical Waste: Fines up to \$1000 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

Food: no concessions due to Covid-19 restrictions

Vendors: Ground space available. Contact the show manager for information.

Health Requirements: Proof of a negative EIA result ("Coggins" certificate) must state the horse's name as it appears on the entry blank. USEF Rule GR 907.3  
Entries without a Coggins test valid throughout the show date will not be accepted. Health certificate dated within 30 days is recommended if crossing state lines.  
Current (within 6 months of show date) vaccination record is required for all horses on show grounds. See USEF GR845 for details.

Hold Harmless Clause: Understanding that horse sports may be hazardous and dangerous, even leading to permanent injury or death, each owner, rider, spectator, and other participant assumes any and all risk of loss or injury and agrees to hold harmless CDCTA, the show committee, all show personnel, and the owners of Beverly Equestrian and all employees of said Owners.

No-shows: If a competitor fails to notify the competition secretary of his/her intention to scratch a test (i.e., is a "no show") competition management reserves the right to fill all of that competitor's subsequent ride times. USEF Rule DR 126.3

Bills and Outstanding Debts of Competitors: CDCTA, its show committee, and Beverly Equestrian will not be responsible for bills and outstanding debts of competitors.

Insurance: All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS: EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.**

It is the rider's responsibility to review and be familiar with the contents of the Competition's Rules, Policies & Procedures. In the event of an inquiry, the USEF rules will prevail.

All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final. Horse show management reserves the privilege of substituting or changing judges and/or officials if it becomes necessary.

The judges' decisions in the show ring are their own responsibility and horse show management accepts no responsibility for these decisions.

Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, or equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire, or otherwise.

The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges.

Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees.

Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groomed horse from the show without being liable for compensation.

In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous/medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform.  
It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and the horses properly presented.

Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

**USDF Membership Benefits:** USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. **Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions:** Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

**Exceptions:**

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

**Memberships Defined**

**Participating Membership (PM):** A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21<sup>st</sup> birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

**Group Membership (GM):** A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

**Business Membership (BM):** A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

**Non-Member (NM) Identification Number:** For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

**Horse Identification (HID) Number:** A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

**Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR):** A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

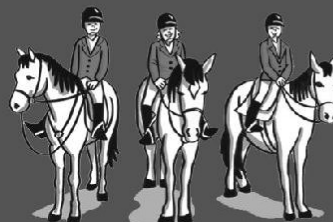

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

#### Membership Statement

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR222) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

#### ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct applicable numbers (USDF and USEF) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.



## USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership of nearly 30,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

## Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program

The USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class presented by Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supply will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

### Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

- a) Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.
- or
- b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

### Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

## WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors,, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree to be bound and abide by the rules, regulations, and policies of USEF as published in the USEF Rule Book and on the website at [www.usef.org](http://www.usef.org), as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

### EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT WARNING:

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY: In conjunction with my participation in any USEF Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: USEF, USEF Recognized Affiliate Associations, the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (USOPC), USEF clubs, members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, licensee, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any USEF Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the USEF Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a USEF Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (**Individually and Collectively, the "Released Parties" or "Event Organizers"**), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature ("Liability") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the USEF Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.

## 2020 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at [www.usdf.org](http://www.usdf.org). Please refer to the 2020 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

### Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

*All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.*

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating\* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record. A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, Life, or Recorded Farm (with Active Farm Owner)). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

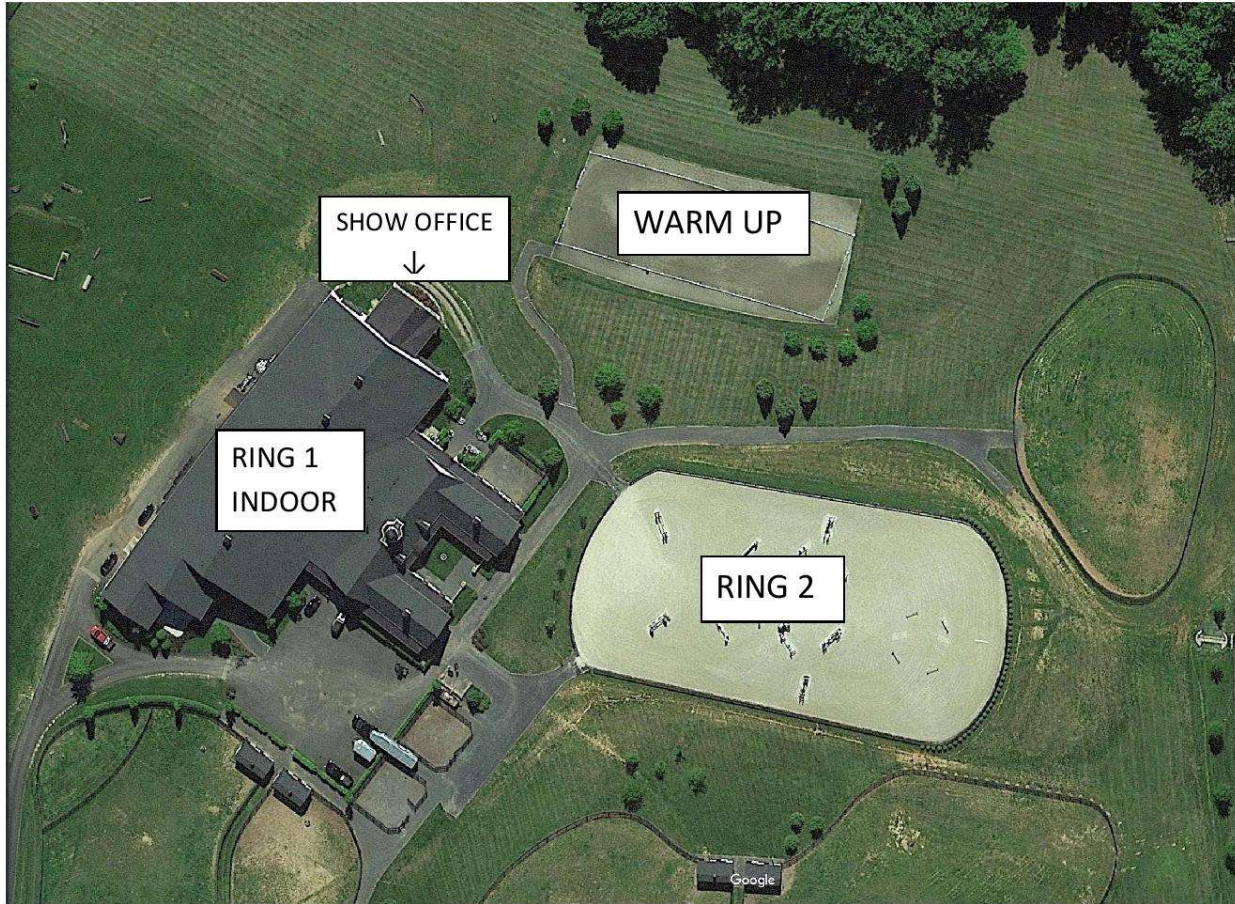
\* PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

**Minimum Qualifying Scores:** One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only open divisions.
